Parks Maintenance: A Changing of the Guard







After nearly a decade with Fairfax City Parks and Recreation, Michael (Mac) Ryan has retired. Change is always bittersweet, and we will miss his dedicated service, professionalism, and quick wit. His retirement did offer an opportunity to re-evaluate the staffing structure of the Division. Over the past decade the workload of the Parks Maintenance Division has increased exponentially while the staffing model has stayed the same, and the number of staff has stayed quite flat, with the exception of one crew position allocated within the FY25 budget.

The previous organizational structure featured a single manager with two parks supervisors. These supervisor positions managed daily crew operations, but did not have a defined role in higher level tasks. A Division review identified that a two manager system would benefit the Division's ability to complete the crew's packed schedule of events, maintenance, and Capital Improvement Projects. This new structure would maintain the same number of FTE's by only replacing a single Park Supervisor.

Within the division, two candidates stood out as more than qualified for the job of Parks Maintenance Manager. Demetric (Boo) Willingham has been with the City for 20 years, 17 of those years with Parks and Recreation. He brings a vast knowledge of athletic facility management, crew leadership, and event supervision. Christopher Fleming has been with the City for over 5 years with 10 years of landscaping experience prior to his time with the City. He is a certified arborist who brings a knowledge of greenspace management, invasive plant removal, and workforce development.

As of September 16th both were promoted to Park Manager. The Park Supervisor position will be advertised in October and ideally filled in November. This is an extremely positive development for the Parks & Recreation Department. Welcome Boo & Christopher to your new roles!


