Parties who wish to make a request to hold a special event on public property (i.e., runs, walks, and festivals) in the City of Fairfax, must complete a Special Event Policy/Application form. The form can found at fairfaxva.gov - search 'Hold Event'. The completed request form can be submitted to Mitzi Taylor, Event and Athletic Manager. All applications must be received at least 90 days prior to the requested date except for road-race requests, which will follow a new policy.

New policy for road-race requests: An annual deadline of July 1 will be set for all road-race request applications with an event date between January 1 through December 31 of the following year. A lottery will be held for all road-race applications submitted by the deadline date except those grandfathered in by the new policy.



PAYMENTS

NEW CANCELLATION, **REFUNDS, AND TRANSFERS**

Cancellations and Refunds: To request a refund, a Refund Request Form must be completed and emailed to camps@fairfaxva.gov

Before May 1st:

If you submit your Refund Request Form prior to May 1st you will be issued a full refund.

May 2nd-June 1st:

Refund Requests submitted after May 1st but before June 1st will be issued a full refund minus your deposit.

No refunds will be given after June 1, 2025.

Please review your summer plans to ensure that if you need to cancel out of a camp you have submitted your Refund Request Form by June 1st. The only exception to this policy is a documented illness or family emergency.

During Camp:

Refunds will not be issued for any missed program days within a camps scheduled sessions due to changed work or vacation schedules, sick days or other non-emergency reasons, or if a camper is sent home early or suspended from attending camp in accordance with the Parent Handbook.

Due to program minimums, transfers MUST be requested at least 14 days prior to the first day of the camp session from which you are withdrawing. Multiple transfers may be subject to a \$25 processing fee.

**Fairfax City reserves the right to cancel a camp if we believe it is in the best interest of participant health and safety. All individuals registered for a canceled camp program will receive a full refund of the registration fee.

STAFF

The City of Fairfax Parks and Recreation Department takes tremendous pride in our amazing camp staff. Many of our camp employees have worked in our camp program for several years. Each camp has a Site Director who manages the program. Specialists in areas of art and sports will visit each site every week to teach different activities. Each camp site has personnel who are trained in standard First Aid and hold a current CPR and AED certification. In order to provide the best care for your child, all staff are required to attend trainings before and throughout the summer.



Black Communities of Fairfax: A History and A Place Called Ilda

An Untold Story—The free Black population of Fairfax Court House dates to at least the 1820's. After the Civil War. newly freed Black citizens expanded the hamlet of Jermantown dramatically. Additional segregated neighborhoods, including School Street, which overlapped today's George Mason University, and Ilda, off Guinea Road, grew and thrived. In the second half of the nineteenth century, residents built schools, churches, and a cemetery. These families persevered under Jim Crow in the early twentieth century. After incorporation, the City of Fairfax annexed these historically Black localities and their separate characters began to disappear. This group of authors with deep roots in Fairfax tells the stories of their communities. The book Black Communities of Fairfax: A History by Etta Willson, Rita Colbert, Linneall Naylor, Rondia Prescott with Jenee Lindner won the Fairfax County History Commission's Cultural Heritage Engagement Award. The book, A Place Called IIda by Thomas Shoop won the Fairfax County History Commission's Nan Netherton Award for excellence in history.





BASKETBALL


